Culburra Beach & Districts Men's Shed

We were offered the opportunity to establish a native bee (Tetragonula Carbonaria, or TC) hive earlier this year by a Nowra native bee enthusiast. Following his instructions, we constructed the required hive (with 45mm thick walls to cope with local climate conditions) and selected a suitable location (with morning sun).

In September he delivered a batch of TC bees 'split' from another of his hives, and we are pleased to see them thriving outside our Shed door. Like many native animals, our local native bees are suffering from habitat loss and diminished local food sources, so we are delighted to offer these bees an opportunity to establish in our local area.

As reported last month, we have now completed the manufacture of 10 'nursery' nest boxes for Wildlife Rescue South Coast to assist them with the care of (particularly) very young orphan brushtail and ringtail possums. These boxes provide safe accommodation during their upbringing and prepare them for their ultimate release back into the wild.

Our "Fix it Monday" continues to be popular, providing service to local residents with minor *Page 4 – Callala Bay News* repairs and refurbishments. We'll give most repair requests our best effort, so please feel free to bring in that job you've been putting off for ages.

CBCA Meeting Report

The CBCA meeting was held on Wed 8 Nov 23 and 17 people attended, including four visitors. Councillors were asked to present their reports to the meeting and the following points were made/raised.

- The Sheaffe St footpath will be fully funded and the timeline for the project will be defined when the funding is released:
- The Joint Regional Planning Panel has made a Gateway Determination that the Sealark Road development will go ahead. It is now out of Council's hands and with the State Government. Council's role now is to provide paperwork. A consultation process will occur.
- The Council is undertaking bureaucratic tasks to facilitate the progress of projects possible using the \$40 million for roads in the Callala area announced prior to the State election.
- Consultation relating to the Coastal Management Plan (CMP) for Callala and the Open Coast is to come out prior to the end of November. Of the 230 actions submitted to Council, 106 were identified as actions needed to be done. In explanation, Open Coast ceases at Hyams Beach and recommences at Sussex Inlet. The area in between is the responsibility of the Federal Government.
- Sixty councils are eligible to submit CMPs. Only 10 have thus far been submitted and \$50 million of the \$80 million available has been allocated. The estimated cost for the Shoalhaven CMP is \$400 million.
- On Monday 29 Nov 23, an extraordinary meeting of Council is being held to discuss the Council's finances and the way forward.
- Mr Stephen Dunshea, the CEO of the Shoalhaven City Council is retiring and a recruitment process will be undertaken for his replacement. His responsibilities are being shared among other council staff in the interim.
- From 15 August 2023, only a Level 3 arborist can remove a tree deemed removable under the 45-degree rule. This has put many arborists out of work. New rules are being designed to allow a "suitably qualified arborist" as determined by WorkCover to undertake tree removal.

Parking Proposal for the Boat Ramp

Secretary John provided a summary of recent proceedings regarding Council's proposals and mentioned submissions sent to Council by James Morris and Duncan Marshall in response to Council's original proposals for 24 restricted parking spaces. An amended design from Council, reducing the 24 restricted spaces to eight followed, and Duncan gave his written approval for the amended design.

After a long discussion, the meeting agreed that the proposed parking restrictions are not needed. The meeting agreed not to provide CBCA endorsement for Duncan Marshall's acceptance of the Council's amended proposal.

Fire Resistance Plan

Gary Chapman has been in communication with the staff in Liza Butler's office on issues relating to fire preparedness and safety in the Callala area. Of note is that a Fire Rating sign is required at the intersection of Forest Road and the highway. Gary contacted Rod Rose, who is working with Sealark Pty Ltd to assist them in resolving planning issues relating to the potential for bushfires. Rod Rose is tasked with identifying Neighbourhood Safer Places and claims there are 5 in Callala Bay and that the developer (Sealark) would identify those sites.

General Secretary

The position "General Secretary" remains vacant, and applications are invited. The General Secretary would work with other executive members and assist in managing and coordinating activities of the Minutes Secretary and Correspondence Secretary.

Australia Day Event

The RFS provide the BBQ for this event and have a back-up crew in case they are called away to assist with a fire. If this happens, additional volunteers will be required. Musicians Kenny and Amanda and clown Magic Daniel have been booked as the entertainment as usual. An event permit has been issued by Council.

The Australia Day raffle will be held. We have promises of prizes from Dallarz Valu, Bunnings, Scott Horsburgh (The Family Butcher), IGA, Club Callala, 2 bottles of wine from a member, a bottle of gin from another member, a large picnic basket with blanket from a member. More would definitely be welcome. Tickets will be sold at the January CBCA sausage sizzle events on 6th and 13th of January 2024, and up to and at the Australia Day event.

Sausage Sizzle Fundraisers

- The dates for these fundraising events have been set for Sat 6 and Sat 13 Jan 24. They will be held outside the IGA. Australia Day Raffle tickets will also be sold on these days and raffle prizes are continuing to be donated.
- CBCA members are also assisting with a BBQ at the Callala Family Butcher on Wed 17 Jan 24.
- Volunteers are needed to help with transport of equipment, cooking and serving at those events. Please advise the Secretary of your assistance.






Bushcare

Those pesky ticks are continuing to cause problems for both Bushcarers and gardeners. I've offered advice about treatment for ticks when they latch onto a person, but here's a suggestion to avoid tick trouble in the first place. It involves treating the clothing you wear in the garden or bush, and this can include hats and socks, with a solution that will repel ticks.

The product is called Equip Debugger Permethrin Treatment. You will need to google that name and purchase the product online,

although you might find some camping shops stock it. Permethrin, is the same chemical that's in the cream I recommended to remove ticks, Lyclear, so it's safe to be in contact with your skin. I used half the liquid provided in 4 litres of water, and was able to treat 2 long sleeve work shirts and 3 pairs of work trousers. The claim is that



once treated, clothing can be machine washed 30 times before the tick repelling effect ends. I have been wearing the treated clothing, plus a hat which I bought already treated with this chemical, every time I've gone into the bush or my garden for over a month. I haven't been bitten by a tick during that time. However once, I did get a tick on me in my garden when I wore non treated clothes. I gave away the unused 10ml of the Debugger liquid to a friend, so this could be an option if you have a friend or neighbour also struggling with ticks this season.

Our team have continued with our regular regeneration work, plus a pleasant diversion which involved a beach walk to remove the weed Sea Spurge from between Red Point and Carama Inlet. We don't need much of an excuse for a beach walk at this time of year! Early on in these columns I wrote about a small plant that was discovered by a visiting ecologist along the banks Callala Creek. The botanical name is Limonium australe, or Australian Sea Lavender.

Our Council supervisor collected some of the seed of the lone Sea Lavender. This plant eeks out a perilous existence on the edge of mudflats and salt marshes, and is rarely found on the South Coast. Sadly strong tidal surges swept away that little plant from the edge of our creek. Fortunately the collected seed had been put in a propagation box at the Bushcare Nursery. I have to admit I did fuss over the tiny seedlings once they germinated, and then carefully transplanted them into growing tubes. A recent inspection showed that the plants that had been in tubes the longest time are showing signs of nutrient deficiency. We think they are craving the salty soil next to the creek. So even though we don't normally plant in the warmer months, a couple of these little plants have been returned to their muddy homeland. Good luck Sea Lavender!



Notes from the Medical Centre

There has been a lot of excitement regarding the new Shingrix (for shingles) vaccine. It is a 2-dose course spaced 2-6 months apart. It is free for people over the age of 65 years, or ATSI over 50 years. We have placed an order for it with the Health Department, but supply is limited at the moment. Your patience is much appreciated during this roll out.

If you have been previously vaccinated with the Zostavax, or have had recent shingles infection, it is advised to wait 12 months prior to initiating the Shingrix vaccination.


I have attached the summary from department of health below:

From 1 November 2023, the shingles vaccine Shingrix[®] will replace Zostavax[®] on the National Immunisation Program (NIP) schedule for the prevention of shingles and post-herpetic neuralgia. It will be available for eligible people most at risk of complications from shingles. A 2-dose course of Shingrix[®] will be available for free for:

- people aged 65 years and older;
- First Nations people aged 50 years and older;
- immunocompromised people aged 18 years and older with the following medical conditions:
 - o haemopoietic stem cell transplant
 - o solid organ transplant
 - o haematological malignancy
 - o advanced or untreated HIV.

Unlike Zostavax[®], Shingrix[®] does not contain any live virus so it can be given to people aged 18 years and over who are immunocompromised

The Digital Information Hub

All Callala Residents should be aware of the digital information screens at the Callala Bay Community Centre and the Callala Beach Progress Hall. These digital information screens have been installed across the Shoalhaven to provide authoritative, accurate and timely information to communities at all times of the year, including in emergency situations.

In normal times, the screens will be displaying real-time information including the daily fire danger rating, weather from the Bureau of Meteorology in addition to promoting local community and Council events relating to each individual community where they're installed.

The screens have been delivered in response to the community's experience of the 2019-20 Currowan Bushfires, where critical communication was severely impacted by power outages and disruptions to the mobile phone network.

This infrastructure is robust enough to overcome the vulnerabilities of standard power through stand-alone solar power systems and satellite communications. An emergency doesn't generally happen in an instant or an immediate vicinity. It builds and may travel long distances over a period. Ensuring timely and accurate information will help with decision making – informed decision making helps people to build resilience to respond better for future decision - making. Each information hub includes a technology upgrade providing satellite connection powered by solar panels delivered to the state of the art



13.5-kilowatt Tesla Powerwall2 battery and 55" portrait information screens accessible both internally and externally to the Council owned facilities where they are installed.


