It's been another busy month at the Shed with a few significant events to be reported.

Thanks to the support and generosity of the Culburra District Community Health Service, 6 of our members were able to successfully complete formal First Aid training. The course was provided by South Coast First Aid and comprised on-line modules and face to face on-site training sessions. Subjects covered included cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and basic emergency life support. Our course instructor, Colleen Allan, was very knowledgeable and enthusiastic to ensure everyone got the best possible outcome from the training.

Last month we were invited to attend a presentation and lunch at the Berry Men's Shed. Four members represented the Shed on 13 April and much enjoyed the presentation and luncheon, as well as the opportunity to discuss areas of mutual concern. A reciprocal visit from Berry to our Shed occurred in the following week, with a further exchange of information and ideas, and we look forward to an ongoing positive relationship. We also got together with the staff and patients of the nearby IRT Retirement Village and Nursing Home for lunch on 19 April, to extend and enhance our close relationship. Our thanks to all staff and residents for their hospitality, and the chance to see how their facilities operate.

Our "Fix it Monday" events have proved popular. Held on the first Monday of each month, we've been able to assist local residents with various repairs to furniture and household items. We can't fix everything but we give each job our best efforts.

Door sales, and sales from the Culburra Beach and Callala Markets, have been very worthwhile, providing cash flow for the purchase of raw materials and tools, plus ongoing operational expenses.

Our native bee and insect hotels were most popular with keen gardeners and those wishing to provide habitat for native insects. We sold out (again) at Callala, and are racing to replenish stocks for May. Possum boxes, large and small, were also in demand.

Bushcare

The past month has been the first time several of our team, including group leader Lesley Oliver, have been able to participate for some time. The advantage of the presence of longer serving members is they are able to bring perspective and have noted the great progress that has been made on our long time sites like Benton Sands and Emmett St/Boorawine Creek Reserve.

At Benton Sands - which is the area between the footpath from the footbridge across Callala Creek back to Callala Beach we tackled small amounts of Lantana, Senna, Asparagus Fern, Cape Gooseberry and Passionfruit. The drop in weed numbers over this very large site is a testament to phenomenal initial work done by our team over 15 years ago. Even in the decade that I've been part of the team I can see the difference that a few hardy voluntary workers can make in a degraded bush land area. The impact of fire through Benton Sands, particularly the 'cool' precautionary fire which was lit by the local RFS in 2017 has also had a beneficial effect. As has these past couple of La Niña years. But honestly, to think that 15 years ago, the significant vegetation through that area was weeds, the transformation is amazing.

At Emmett St/Boorawine Creek given that this Reserve is a mix of Natural Area and Park Reserve surrounded by housing, mostly the vegetation is much less dense. However the removal over the past 15 years of most of the big weeds like Lantana and Senna, and a bit of heroic work by yours truly removing much of the weedy vegetation from the section of Boorawine Creek between Derwent St and Warrego Place has meant in recent times we have been able to focus on what Bush Care is really all about - and that is regeneration of degraded bushland areas. This means gradual painstaking work removing all non indigenous plants from an area, one square metre at a time. And then, what sparks joy in the heart of the Bush Carer, is observing not just the existing native plants begin to flourish, but magically, seed that has lain dormant in the soil for many years will germinate. So within that one square metre of we get to experience the reemergence of the natural biodiversity, and there may easily be twenty different plant species varying from tiny fragile threads of grasses, to large shrubs and trees. Nothing boring about watching grass grow to a Bush Carer!



Native Ginger

We have discovered a mystery plant in the Boorawine bushland, Native Ginger. This plant shouldn't grow south of the Central Coast, but strangely a couple of plants have shown up in a shaded area near the creek. Hopefully, there will be an answer to this mystery in next month's column

Key points of The Halloran Trust (THT) rezoning for Callala Subdivision

- In Jun 22, the Callala district liaison group with THT submitted objections to the subdivision, based on planning process and a failure to address the demands of the Jervis Bay Settlement Strategy (namely, ecologically sustainable development, which requires zero net ecological loss) and about the absence of an independent assessment of the ecological and off-set studies / reports by Halloran.
- 2. The Shoalhaven City Council (SCC) meeting on 14 Jun 23 called for a full assessment to be reported to Council.
- 3. Submissions closed with Dept of Planning and Environment (DPE) later in Jun 22, although SCC can submit assessments and information at any time as it is part of the assessment process.
- 4. Of public submissions, 97% opposed the proposed rezoning, the majority on environmental and ecological grounds, others on planning grounds.
- 5. DPE's compiled assessment report (DPE assessment) –comprises about 9 pages of "tick boxes" based on the applicant's submissions, see https://pp.planningportal.nsw.gov.au/ppr/lep-decision/planning-proposal-callala-bay-and-kinghorne-point-halloran-trust-lands-rezoning.
- 6. The accompanying document (submissions to DPE) is titled "What we heard", being a very short summary report of submissions made after the exhibition was advertised or comments were solicited by DPE see https://doc.shoalhaven.nsw.gov.au/ Displaydoc.aspx?Record=D22/439608) and DPE announced the decision/s by press release before the "assessments" were available https://doc.shoalhaven.nsw.gov.au/ Displaydoc.aspx?Record=D22/433600)
- 7. A Callala resident initiated a Govt Information Public Access search for a local group seeking what assessment was made (if any) by SCC as required by the planning

process and rules. The results showed several issues, specifically;

- a. A specialist report was called for by staff internally from relevant staff in 2021, then in June 2022 it was sought by Council resolution.
- b. A report was produced by professional specialists within Council, which did not support the methodology and tests applied and the proposed off-sets.

c. Such report was not sent to DPE, and was not tabled for the Council, the CEO, or Councillors.

9. The matter is likely to return to Council meeting in the next month.

Notes from the Medical Centre

Callala Medical Centre is now running our annual influenza vaccine program, free influenza vaccine (funded by the federal government) is offered for the following groups:

- all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people aged 6 months and over
- all children aged 6 months to less than 5 years of age
- all individuals aged 5 years and over with medical risk conditions
- pregnant women (influenza vaccine can be given at any stage of pregnancy)
- people aged 65 years and over (a vaccine that is specifically designed to produce a higher immune response is available for this group).

For those who do not fulfill those eligibility but wishes to have the influenza vaccine, we strongly encourage you to do so, via your local pharmacy (in most cases a script is not even necessary).

As always, we will be running our vaccination clinics multiple times through the week. To make bookings, please ring our friendly team at Callala Medical Centre, or through the HotDoc Booking site.

We will continue to offer Pfizer vaccines for those who wish to have their fifth COVID boosters.

We often look at wars through a national prism, forgetting that soldiers suffered and families lost their children on all sides. We forget the people they left behind. Sometimes, we forget soldiers who remind us of difficult parts of our history. Let's take a look at some forgotten Anzac stories.

Defending their homes

Last year ... Erdem Koç reminded us that there are many stories surrounding the 'Anzac legend', and some are much less known than others. In his article for The Conversation, he explained how the battle of Gallipoli was a small part of a bigger combat that lasted 18 months for the Turks, who were defending their home.

'If anything, the notion of 'sacrificing for freedoms' is truer for the Turks,' he says. 'Had the hundreds of thousands of young men not joined the army and headed to Gallipoli, had the bravery displayed on the frontlines not happened, it's without doubt modern Turkey would not have been formed.' He adds:

'For the Australians, the battle was one fought for the imperialistic purposes of a self-serving empire, which had control over young Australia's foreign policy. For the Turks, it was about defending the nation from enemy invasion.'

In 1934, Turkey's first President encouraged reconciliation between Australia, New Zealand and Turkey. Mustafa Kemal Ataturk wrote:

Here in this country of ours,

You, the mothers,

Who sent their sons from far away countries,

Wipe away your tears.

Your sons are now lying in our bosom

And are in peace

After having lost their lives on this land they have

Become our sons as well.

So although we were part of the invading force, there is now a measure of unity in how we deal *Page 20 – Callala Bay News* with Anzac Day. But what about the stories of Australian soldiers that don't quite fit into our ideas of what an Anzac looks like?

Indigenous soldiers at Gallipoli

Indigenous Australians were not legally Australian citizens until 1967. So in 1914, there were significant cultural barriers for Indigenous Australians and this extended to joining the army. By 1917, these barriers were slightly relaxed and some soldiers were allowed to enlist. Gary Oakley, a war memorial Indigenous liaison officer at the Australian War Memorial, explains that Indigenous Australians were treated equally in the army:

'Once in the service, as an indigenous soldier, you were treated as an equal; you have the same options for pay. When you are in the trenches, you don't have the option of disliking the person behind you.'

Historians think 50 Aboriginal soldiers fought in Gallipoli. Thirteen of them died there. It's thought 800-1000 Aboriginal soldiers served in the Australian Imperial Force during World War I, with around 250-300 killed.

There are now efforts to highlight this history. In 2014, the Dawn Service started with Able Seaman Darren Davies, from the Yidinji people, playing the didgeridoo. He declared:

'There're some nerves there – but on the day it's not the nerves, it's more the pride in coming out and being part of the Anzac tradition ... and what it means for indigenous men and women. That's important to me. And I hope it leaves a mark for future generations.'

Women: at war and left behind.

There are other stories about Anzacs we might not know, like those of the women who went to war, and those who were left behind.

During WWI, women made a major contribution to the war effort, at the front as nurses, and at home, working and taking care of the families that soldiers had to leave behind. According to the Australian Department of Defence, 2,562 AANS nurses joined active service during WWI, with 423 of these women serving in Australia.

One story that has been highlighted recently

is the story of the 'Lighthouse Girl', Fay Howe, told in a book by Dianne Wolfer.

The Lighthouse Girl signaled to the departing fleet in morse code, becoming the last human contact some of the young soldiers would ever have with Australia.

Weeks later, Fay started to receive postcards from the Middle East. They were addressed to 'The little girl on Breaksea Island'. Her story inspired this amazing artwork.

Lest we forget

Exploring our hidden stories is important when commemorating Anzac Day. If we don't know the full picture, we aren't respecting the whole amazing history of our involvement in global conflict.



Hello everyone, It was a warm afternoon when we met for our April meeting. President Bev brought along her granddaughter and great- granddaughter and introduced them as "mermaids". These lovely ladies dress up in a costume mermaid tail and sequined top and swim in the water. This is referred to as "mermaiding." Photo shoots are usually done on various beaches or underwater. We always learn something new at meetings and it isn't always about plants!

The theme for our display table was World Earth Day which was established in 1970 and is held on April 22nd to demonstrate support for environmental protection. What better way to celebrate it than bringing in something growing from our garden-flowers, herbs, vegetables, or natives. President Bev brought in a vase of red, hot chillies with foliage attached and one member was keen to take some of the chillies home.

Chillies (also called chilli pepper) are mild to extremely hot, fleshy fruit that can be green, red, yellow, orange, or brown. Their shape too varies from long and skinny to round and fat . Chilli is part of the Solanaceae family, which also includes its close relative the capsicum along with tomato, eggplant, and potato. The smallest chillies are the hottest and the seeds and stems are usually removed to reduce the heat. The heat of a chilli comes from a chemical known as 'capsaicin,' which is particularly concentrated in seeds.

Chillies can be grown between Spring to Autumn in a warm sheltered position .They can be grown in pots but don't overcrowd them. Chillies prefer a rich, well-drained soil and reliable moisture. Dig in well-rotted organic matter such as compost or well-rotted manure before planting. Fruit can be picked at any stage or left on the bush to ripen and develop full colour and flavour. Frequent picking encourages more flowers and more fruit. Use secateurs or scissors to harvest ripe fruit to avoid breaking the branches and always wash your hands well after harvesting chillies to avoid burning to your skin. Take care when cooking with them too. The Carolina Reaper is officially the World's Hottest Pepper as ranked by Guinness Book of World Records. The Bullhorn chilli is one of the mildest as it is sweet like a capsicum.




